Problem in the recovery of servicemen missing in action (MIA)

More than **80,000** (about half of them are in the Pacific) service members are missing but the US government has on average identified only **72 sets** of remains per year since 2004. At this rate, the vast majority of these remains will never be recovered or given the recognition and dignified burial they deserve.

Kuentai-USA is very concerned about this dilemma and is actively involved to resolve it. We believe that the final healing of the wounds of war will be hastened by the mutual respect and cooperation of both US and Japanese concerned citizens.
